

Progress on Bowes Park station

The station is looking much better, new signage has been put up and it has been painted. The building allocated for two artist's studios on the station platform have been decorated. This is the result of on going work with WAGN, Railtrack, MPs and the BPCA. Resurfacing on the bridge is on the way.

However, the Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Security Survey on the station and surrounding area has decided that the reported crime statistics do not show a need for CCTV cameras as a priority.

The BPCA had been very excited about the proposed installation of CCTV on the bridge by the local authority and also on the station platform by WAGN. If

Greening Bowes Park

these measures were put in place we would be able to move to phase 2 of the plan to have artist's studios on the station. Their presence would have added to the process of making the station a safer and more pleasant place.

Due to the recommendation in this report, WAGN have had second thoughts about implementing CCTV and Haringey Arts council are understandably reluctant to open the studios until safety measures are in place. However, we are pleased to say that WAGN are reconsidering their position.

The lack of sufficient evidence of crime impacts on many of our projects to improve the area. The police need evidence of crime to recommend installation of CCTV or other improvements to the area's security.

If we want to make changes it is really important that we report every incident, however small.

So please, if you are a victim of or witness any crime in the area, call the police on **020 8808 1212** stating that you are from the BPCA, insist they make a record of the call and take a note of the officer you speak to. Or make a note of the date and time and any other details and drop them in to Mr Lucas at Lucas Bros 132 Myddleton Road or leave details on the contact numbers at the end of the newsletter. This will make a real difference.

Traffic situation

Speeding vehicles outside your front door from dawn to dusk? Rush hour road congestion in your street? Damage to your or your neighbour's vehicle parked in your road?

The BPCA recognises that daily rat-running, congestion and speed of traffic in our local area is becoming a feature of agitation amongst the residents of Bowes Park, and the cause of an increasing number of road traffic accidents.

We also recognise that the situation has worsened since the flow of traffic on the dreadful section of the North Circular Road between Green Lanes and Pinkham Way continues to be held up owing to lane reductions. This has led to drivers taking the option of 'rat running' through the residential streets of Bowes Park to avoid this congestion.

Mayor Livingstone's decision to dump the proposed A406 road-widening scheme looks certain to give our area no respite from this mess, unless the local authorities or Transport for London (TFL) implements alternative local road schemes.

Representations from the BPCA have been made to TFL, both local MPs, all local councillors and the Haringey Highways Officer. So far, we have had sympathetic hearings and controlled parking zones mooted as the means to funding any traffic-calming scheme, but no action. Our local authorities are not showing any signs of working together on this issue, which is of great concern to us.

The BPCA committee wants to continue raising the profile of this debate. We will continue to talk to all our local representatives but WE NEED YOUR HELP.

We will be circulating an appeal/lobby form in local shops in Myddleton and Whittington Roads for residents to sign. Please look out for them.

Wardens take to the streets

Joint funding from central government and Haringey Council has made possible the appointment of two Street Wardens. They will take up their posts in the summer, after training.

The new wardens will be recognised by their uniforms and will become a frequent sight in Bowes Park, particularly the shopping areas and around Bowes Park station. Working together in shifts between 8 am and 8 pm seven days a week, they will be a visible deterrent to crime and anti-social behaviour.
